When a hospital or healthcare organization is inspected, OSHA usually requests the organization's OSHA Recordkeeping documents. It is critical that all OSHA Recordkeeping documents be accurate and up to date pursuant to the latest OSHA Recordkeeping standards. Hospital and healthcare organizations not compliant with OSHA's Recordkeeping standard may be exposed to costly OSHA citations.

In addition OSHA's new rule [requiring certain covered establishments](#) to submit their OSHA injury and illness data (Forms 300A, 300, and 301 data) means that OSHA will be reviewing all OSHA Recordkeeping documents annually.

It is therefore more important than ever to insure that your OSHA Recordkeeping documents are accurate and up to date.
