Dear Friend,

I am pleased to announce that my office will be hosting an Adult/Adolescent Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Clinical Training. The free two-day training will be offered on December 2-3, 2025, in Springfield, Illinois and is designed for medical professionals who have completed the 40-hour didactic Adult/Adolescent SANE Training and are working to complete their Illinois Adult/Adolescent SANE Clinical Training Log.

The goal of the Adult/Adolescent SANE Clinical Training is to provide clinicians with an opportunity to improve their knowledge and skills when working with sexual assault patients. Attendance assists with completing requirements of the Clinical Training Log. The training will consist of hands-on examinations involving the use of standardized patients. SANE-A preceptors will demonstrate techniques and direct clinicians throughout the hands-on training.

The Office of the Illinois Attorney General will select candidates to participate in the Adult/Adolescent SANE Clinical Training based on clinical training log completion status and geographic representation. Applications will be reviewed, and acceptances will be announced via e-mail on November 7, 2025. Space is limited and there is a maximum capacity of 32 participants in this training. The nursing objectives for the Adult/Adolescent SANE Clinical Training are:

- Identify key components of a physical exam
- Demonstrate the complete head-to-toe assessment
- Identify specific structures of the female and male anogenital anatomy.
- Demonstrate the proper use of specialized examination techniques and speculum insertion
- Demonstrate effective history taking skills
- Demonstrate effective patient education of the Medical Forensic Exam Brochure, the ISP Consent forms and the ISP Discharge forms.
- Identify the critical components of clinical photography to document findings
- Identify the rationale behind collection of specific evidentiary specimens
- Demonstrate patient education regarding toxicology, consent and testing using the ISP toxicology consent form
- Demonstrate proper collection, packaging and maintenance of chain of custody
- Identify the key components of a strangulation assessment.
- Formulate a care plan for a sexual assault patient based on the overall assessment and diagnosis

The Adult/Adolescent SANE Clinical training is offered by the Office of the Illinois Attorney General at no cost to the participant. Participants will be responsible for all meals, transportation and travel expenses.
